

CUFA Opens a New Cultural Campus in an Empty Set of Buildings in the Old Town of Prague

In April, the large complex of buildings in Hybernská, which has been empty so far, is going to open to the public for the first time. In cooperation with the Prague City Council, the Faculty of Arts, Charles University, launches a multifunctional space which will bring together creative students, academics, and artists, and will also cater for Prague citizens and visitors.

The festival *Diversity Week: City and Emotions* (10 – 13 April 2017), is going to be the starting point of the transformation of the empty set of seven houses into an open community space where the public, the academia, students, and artists can meet and cooperate. The varied programme of the festival attempts to show how these different spheres could be connected.

The festival includes workshops, exhibitions, videomapping, escape games, film screenings and concerts, and is **completely free of charge**.
