

Special requirements of the admission procedure for Follow-up Master's study programmes accredited in languages other than Czech

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ANGLOPHONE LITERATURES AND CULTURES

specializations: British and Commonwealth Literatures and Studies; American Literature and Studies; Irish Studies; Critical and Cultural Theory

Students choose their specialization at the end of Year 1

form and type of study: full-time, master's (follow-up graduate) programme

The language of instruction is English. This is a fee-paying programme; the annual fee is CZK 140 000.

entrance examination: one-round (written – assessment of materials submitted)

entrance examination description:

assessment of material submitted in English (100 points)

- 1) MA project proposal in English of 900–1000 words (80 points)
- 2) bibliography (20 points): selected bibliography of 10 relevant secondary sources, with 1 item discussed in relation to the MA project and its methodology in 200 words

assessment criteria for the MA project proposal:

- 80-65: clear and inventive, perhaps some minor mistakes or inconsistencies
- 64-50: acceptable overall, some issues but still showing promise
- 49-35: average in all respects but acceptable despite issues
- 34-20: poor, little promise, only a hypothetical chance of acceptance
- 19-1: major issues, no merit
- Failure to submit the project proposal will result in 0 points.

assessment criteria for the bibliography:

- 20-15: relevant choice of secondary material, well-structured, the selected source tied convincingly to the MA project, only minor issues
- 14-10: well-structured selection of secondary material, some issues with the selected source but acceptable overall
- 9-5: mediocre presentation and secondary material selection, persistent issues
- 4-1: poor presentation, major issues (e.g. missing selected source)
- Failure to submit the bibliography will result in 0 points.

other requirements: Applicants submit the following via the information system by 31. 3. 2025:

- MA project proposal in English of 900–1000 words
- selected bibliography of 10 relevant secondary sources, with 1 item discussed in relation to the MA project and its methodology in 200 words
- transcript of records from the applicant's previous degree – this serves for orientation only and is not included in the entrance exam assessment. Certificates of English proficiency are not required.

Material submitted later than 31. 3. 2025 will not be considered.

information on graduate prospects:

The study programme Anglophone Literatures and Cultures builds on the rich tradition of the study of English at Charles University, together with the recent trends in international literary, critical and cultural theories. The programme is divided into the following specialisations: British and Commonwealth Literatures and Studies, American Literature and Studies, Irish Studies, and Critical and Cultural Theory focused on contemporary theoretical approaches and the relation of literature to film and new media. Students take a wide range of mandatory optional courses within their specialisation, complemented by courses from other specialisations and other study programmes offered at Charles University. This

provides them with a comparative perspective on Anglophone literatures and cultures on the one hand, and a desirable interdisciplinary perspective on their focal area on the other. The general objective is to provide an understanding of cultural and historical diversity and the dynamics of development of Anglophone cultures based on a solid theoretical and methodological grounding. Graduates of the programme will find employment as publisher's editors, commentators with an Anglophone focus in the media, translators of literary and academic texts, diplomats, civil servants with expertise in the Anglophone world, and following the completion of a supplementary course in pedagogy, also as teachers in institutions of secondary and tertiary education.

entrance examination: two-rounds (written – assessment of materials submitted; followed by an oral interview)

entrance examination description:

1st round – written part: assessment of materials sent – assessment of MA research proposal (max. 50 points)

Applicants are required to send an outline of their MA research proposal via the student information system by 31 March 2025; the outline of approx. 5 A4 pages must contain references and comply with established academic standards. The submitted research proposal must be clearly formulated, present an original approach to a topic in the field of logic and have potential for serving as a starting point for a diploma thesis to be written in the course of the programme.

2nd round – oral examination

Topics covered in the BA programme in Logic at the Faculty of Arts, Charles University:

- 1) classical logic I, II (max. 20 points)
- 2) set theory and recursion theory (max. 20 points)
- 3) philosophy of logic (max. 10 points)

research proposal evaluation criteria:

- clearly formulated and exhibiting expertise, contains only minor deficiencies: 50–38 points
- clearly formulated and exhibiting expertise, contains major deficiencies, but is still acceptable: 37–25 points
- weak and unconvincing, very low probability of successful completion of project: 24–13 points
- totally unsatisfactory, exhibiting poor knowledge of the topic: 12–1 points
- failure to submit project outline: 0 points

information on graduate prospects:

Logic is a theoretical programme which relies on mathematical methods and which can be applied in mathematics, computation and specific fields of philosophy. Logic has also connections to linguistics and law theory. In general, graduates can be employed in all areas which deal with formal and quantitative methods and rely on critical analysis of problems, often in formalized environments (software or legal companies, government or educational institutions). Graduates can continue in a doctoral programme (PhD) in logic.

3) демонстрация знания политических и социальных реалий современной России (макс. 40 баллов)

- список прочитанной литературы
